## XX-20XX [O-8601] Abacus - chess wristwatch

Last summer I received the picture below from the well-known German collector of chess computers Hans-Jürgen Schäfer, asking for more information about this wristwatch from Abacus. Unfortunately I now see this watch for the first time, and I could not find any data in my database. Apparently it is a rare appearance and therefore a curiosity. I am also in the dark about the date of the phenomenon, so the years zero is just a suggestion. On the right-hand side of the photo is a very old smartphone with PDA functions. Is this a Palm Treo 650 from 2003/2004? I won't go into more detail, but it is nice to see that the Abacus PDA wristwatch synchronises the chess game with the smartphone. Apparently it was a nice gadget for those days, and now for some collectors a collector's item? So I can't help Hans-Jürgen with information about this special chess wristwatch.
